Conference on Christianity in the Middle East 9th till 12th of December 2015, Vienna

THE INSTITUTE OF EASTERN CHRISTIAN STUDIES, Radboud University Nijmegen (The Netherlands) and PRO ORIENTE jointly organize a conference on Christianity in the Middle East with a focus on ecumenical thinking as developed in this region, both historically and to-day. The organizers believe that the long tradition of ecumenical thinking in this region and the way the wounds of the past have been acknowledged and overcome deserve to be better known in European theological faculties.

The course is intended for <u>advanced Master or PhD students</u> of Orthodox and Eastern Catholic theological faculties in Eastern Europe (15 students maximum). The course will take place at the KARDINAL-KÖNIG-HAUS in Vienna.
